

Donor - Archivist Agreement

**Records of
The American Psychological Association
Psychological Ethics and National Security Debate**
(Records of the APA PENS Debate)

The *Records of the APA PENS Debate* constitute one of two subcollections of the *APA PENS Collection*:

the *Unofficial Records of the APA PENS Task Force*, deposited by Task Force member Jean Maria Arrigo, Ph.D., in the *Intelligence Ethics Collection*, Archives of the Hoover Institution on War, Revolution, and Peace, at Stanford University, in August 2006, and

the *Records of the APA PENS Debate*, collected through interested, non-Task Force parties by Wade Pickren, Ph.D., for deposit in December 2010.

The follow agreement applies to Donors to the *Records of the APA PENS Debate* and to Archivist Wade Pickren:

1. Donor will have the right to use his or her donated items for research, education, and publication at any time and will retain copyright for any of his or her products.
2. Donor acknowledges that he or she will receive no remuneration or material compensation for donated items.
3. Archivist agrees to honor Donor's restrictions on access to donated items for the time periods specified. (For ease of administering the *Records*, only the following time periods may be specified for any restricted item: January 1, 2010; January 1, 2020; or January 1, 2030.)
4. Through November 2010, Archivist will make available to interested parties, by appointment, concurrently unrestricted items of the *Records*. (This arrangement allows a period of public access to items whose restriction lapses on January 1, 2010, prior to deposit in a public archive where the *Records* may be unavailable during processing.)
5. In December 2010, Archivist will deposit the complete *Records of the APA PENS Debate* in the *Intelligence Ethics Collection*, Archives of the Hoover

Institution on War, Revolution, and Peace, at Stanford University, Stanford, California. In addition, Archivist may deposit a copy of the *Records* in a public archive recognized for psychology collections. The receiving archive(s) will honor Donor's restrictions. If Archivist withdraws from the project prior to December 2010, all items collected up to that time will be deposited as stated above.

6. Beginning January 1, 2010, Archivist and regularly employed archival assistants may access all of the *Records of the APA PENS Debate* for the purposes of organizing, creating finding aids, and duplicating prior to deposit in the permanent archive(s). Restrictions on access will otherwise be maintained. (Prior organization will promote timely and thorough processing of the *Records* in the receiving archive.)
7. Archivist, at his discretion, will return redundant, minor, and peripheral items to Donor if he or she can be located; Archivist may destroy such items if unable to locate Donor by November 1, 2010.
